I know that we have a long road to recovery in front of us, but I wanted you to know that I am heavily involved, committed to the task and determined to advocate for the people of my electorate who have been affected by the floods.

I have visited Fitzroy Crossing 12 times in the 10 weeks since the initial stages of this natural disaster and have also had the opportunity to go to many of the communities in the area that have been flood affected. Following each of these visits, I am always amazed by the people from these towns and communities who are working so hard to recover from the devastation that these floods have caused.

From the community members. outset, community groups, community leaders and others have stepped up to help out where they can and I am so happy to see place-based solutions being put in position and being formalised. astounded by the work ethic of all of the agencies and people involved in rescue and working on recovery from this event. The devastation to property, infrastructure and country has been quite overwhelming for many and the recovery process will not occur overnight. In saying that, if we reflect on the speed with which projects such as the works on the highway between Derby and Broome, it gives us hope that it will not take too long for other milestones to be met.

New Financial Assistance

The Premier has announced a **\$1000** payment for eligible people who had their house damaged by the Kimberley Floods.

The money will be given on a prepaid card. It can be used to buy clothing, tools, household goods and other personal items.

People who were 18 years old on or before 10 Jan 2023 and had their home damaged by the flood are eligible. How to apply: An online form at dfes.smartygrants.com.au/PremiersFl oodPayment

In person at a Flood Hub in Fitzroy Crossing, Derby or Broome, or the Community Outreach Team visiting your community.

If possible, bring ID and proof of address when applying.

Free Ferry Service



A free ferry service is now running every day to help people get across the Fitzroy River.

Ferries will run every day from both sides of the river: Between 9am and 3pm, the ferry will leave every hour.

The ferry will also run as needed in the morning from 7-9am, and in the afternoon from 3-5pm. What you need to know:

No bookings needed. Check in 15 minutes before departure.

You will need to tell the workers your name, weight and weight of luggage before going on the ferry.

There is no parking on the west side. Parking is available near the Fitzroy River Lodge on the east side.

The ferry is not taking vehicles yet. More details about vehicles will be shared when available.
