


Stronger together: A Celebration Event

Funding now available for environment, heritage and cultural projects

The state and federal governments this week released details of the latest round of funding to help the Fitzroy Valley community to build back better from the January floods.

The Environment, Heritage and Culture Assets Flexible Grants Program is targeted towards:

- Incorporated associations
- Prescribed bodies corporate
- Charities and non-for-profit organisations
- Primary producers

- Owners or operators of heritage sites
- Local governments
- Government agencies

If you fall into one of these groups, you can now apply for grants to support projects that clean-up, restore, recover from or monitor the long-term impacts to environment, heritage and cultural assets.

This new funding support presents a great opportunity to support on-Country activities that enable Traditional Owners to reconnect with Country that has been impacted by flooding.

The Department of Primary Industries & Regional Development will look after delivery of the program which offers grants in two categories:

- A small grant category between \$10,000 and \$100,000.
- A large grant category between \$100,001 and \$500,000.

Western Australia's Minister for Emergency Services, Stephen Dawson, said "Reconnecting with Country, undertaking clean-up and restoration of heritage and conservation sites and carrying out custodial responsibilities is critical to the wellbeing of Traditional Owners through the recovery."

Assembly of God Church in Fitzroy Crossing

Warren, along with his wife Sheena and son Thomas, has led Fitzroy Crossing's Assembly of God church since January 2005 although the church's roots date back to the early '90s. We touched base with them about the impact the floods had on the church, how they rebuilt and the support they received.



The floods affected us much like a lot of the residents. Initially we saw the water on the back fence and decided to have some fun in the river. However, when we got back we realised how high the water had come and started preparing. We moved furniture in the church despite not believing it would come up that high. The church endured 800mm of water damage, which led to extensive repairs, including new walls and rebuilt toilets. We also did upgrades due to wear and tear, such as electrical upgrades and the installation of industrial ceiling fans. We've still got a lot of work to do but it's slowly coming together.

When the floods happened, I sent out a video and letter to the churches around Australia that support us, which resulted in a significant amount of support from people we didn't even know. We received \$70 000 as well as people flying in to support us. We are extremely grateful for the help and support that we have received over this time, particularly John and Amanda from the hardware store in supporting our rebuild. They were extremely helpful in getting building supplies and being able to have things so close was amazing. Also, the Flood Hub keeping everyone aware of what has been going on and all the funding that we have received has really helped.

Looking back on it realising that we went through something significant and listening to other people's stories of what they went through was really devastating. We are used to helping and supporting people and not being able to do something to help was difficult emotionally. We do believe that through our belief and trust in God, He helps us to get through and that has been where we draw our strength from. Despite all the challenges, we hang on to our belief with everything we have.

Volunteer Firefighters recognised for outstanding efforts during the floods

Fitzroy Crossing Volunteer Fire and Emergency Services, who rescued more than 150 people during the Kimberley flood crisis, were honoured with the Firefighting Team Achievement Award at the 2023 DFES WA Fire & Emergency Services Awards on 9 September. The team were praised for their incredible bravery despite the extreme conditions that they worked in.

The Crossing's own Zoe Creach was also individually recognised for her contribution, winning the Firefighting Youth Achievement Award. At just 19 years of age, Zoe is no stranger to lending a hand, having been a member of the Crossing's VFES for three years. VFES captain Richard Oman said Zoe "has been a very valued member of the team", even when the call for help comes at 3am.

Ian Cooksey was a well-deserving finalist in the Individual Achievement Award category for his standout contribution during the floods. Ian's local knowledge and compassion made him a local hero during and after the event, volunteering countless hours in rescue and recovery efforts.
