
New Fitzroy Bridge Opening 10 December

Fitzroy Valley Recovery Team at the Tidy Towns Awards

On Friday, 24th Nov the Fitzroy Valley Recovery team consisting of Marcelle Coakley, Colleen Garner as well as Keith Andrews (Countryman Rubbish Removal), Fiona Bell (Fitzroy Bridge Alliance) and Willigan Ross were in Perth for the 2023 Tidy Towns Sustainable Communities Awards.

This year, the Fitzroy Valley was put on the map as a finalist in the Community Action and Well-being category, for the remarkable work that has been done as part of the recovery after Ex-Tropical Cyclone Ellie and Associated Flooding.



Unfortunately, the top prize was not taken this time, but as a finalist, the Fitzroy Valley was recognized and commended for its achievements in recovery. The community response and collaboration efforts as well as the increase in employment opportunities and the overall resilience that has fostered the reconstruction of the Valley was much-admired by the judges.

The importance of community spirit in the success of projects such as the development of the Flood Hub, the new Fitzroy River Bridge and the ongoing infrastructure works on roads and houses were highlighted in the recovery project.

These awards highlight and recognize regional and remote communities for sustainable projects and positive environmental outcomes as well as community response. Keeping our town tidy can be as simple as picking up litter or taking out the rubbish or it can involve bigger projects that help reserve the beauty of the Fitzroy Valley.

The Fitzroy Valley District High School is keeping our town tidy by creating the FVDHS 2023 Rubbish Sign Project. In a proactive step towards environmental conservation, students from Year 4, 5, and 6 at Fitzroy Valley District High School are creating an anti-littering sign for the old crossing.

This initiative was set in motion by their teacher, Ms. Sally Dix, and her colleague, following their collection of a considerable amount of rubbish from the old crossing area. This incident, highlighting the severe littering problem, was shared with the students, leading to discussions on environmental responsibility.

The project aims to increase awareness about littering and its impacts on our country, and has received support from the Shire of Derby/West Kimberley. The installation of the sign at the old crossing, expected in the next couple of weeks, represents a significant step in the school and community's efforts to preserve the local environment.
