Upgrades to the Fitzroy Crossing Visitor Centre and Flood Hub

The Shire of Derby/West Kimberley is thrilled to confirm upgrades to our public access way at the Fitzroy Crossing Visitor Centre is now complete!

Now with a brand new front door, the team at the Fitzroy Crossing Visitor Centre are available to support community with DOT enquiries, Shire enquiries and tourism information, between 8:30AM - 4PM Mon - Fri.



The Flood Hub is still operational and the team will continue to support you through your recovery journey.

The Hub will now have reduced opening hours and will operate on an appointment-only basis three days a week, with Tuesday being the exception—offering a walk-in service from 8 AM to 12 noon.

Also, Fitzroy Crossing Library services and books have now moved back into the Flood Hub area.

Come and speak to the team about any concerns you have about your recovery journey. They can help you with:

- Applying for or tracking your application progress for the Lord Mayor's Distress Relief Fund (applications close on November 30, 2024)
- Assistance with GIVIT requests
- Assistance by Industry Recovery Officers and Morrgul with guidance through the Fitzroy Valley Aboriginal Business Program.

### **Brooking Channel Update**

The deck of the 127 metre-long Brooking Channel Bridge is now in place, marking an important project milestone.

The deck was constructed on a casting bay immediately to the west, before being pushed over the top of the bridge piers. The launch was completed in under a week.

With the deck now in place, the attention turns to finishing works that will include the asphalting of the bridge deck and the approaches in readiness for opening in late 2024.

The old Brooking Channel Bridge was demolished in June 2024 marking a significant milestone in the project timeline. The demolition took place over four days, clearing the way for the construction of the new bridge to begin.



This was followed by extensive works to install 18 steel piles, between 5 and 14 metres in length, as well as initial pier construction works.

Currently the project has more than 120 local workers, some who are taking part in construction, hospitality and security training. On-the-ground training has focused on mentoring and learning, allowing for creating an inclusive culture that gives the team the skills to work in a number of different construction and hospitality positions.

### Latest Fitzroy Valley Flood Recovery Working Group meeting held on country in Wangkatjungka

The Fitzroy Valley Flood Recovery Working Group recently held its 19th working group meeting, marking a significant milestone in the Fitzroy Valley flood recovery process. Since the first meeting on 17 February 2023, the working group has played an important role in ensuring representatives of community come together to discuss and give advice on the ongoing recovery efforts.

What made this meeting particularly special was that it was the first meeting held on country, hosted at Wangkatjungka. The on country meeting format allowed members to engage with others in a different setting and the next meeting is set for Noonkanbah community on 22 October.

The majority of the agenda focused on a collaborative effort with IPS Management Consultants to codesign the flood recovery review process. The intention is to create a recovery model that ensures local communities are at the heart of the review, incorporating their perspectives and experiences to guide future planning.



Additionally, the working group considered three community grant applications to verify their authenticity, ensuring they were from community members. This work is important in keeping authenticity and transparency in our flood recovery efforts.

As the working group continues its work, it remains an integral part of the Fitzroy Valley flood recovery, demonstrating the power of collective action in addressing the challenges faced by the region.

The New Fitzroy River Bridge Project's remarkable achievement in completing the bridge in just 11 months has set a new benchmark in innovative construction, overcoming complex challenges and delivering vital infrastructure for the community, particularly in a remote region.
