SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is for Council to meet its statutory compliance requirement to review annually the delegation of specified powers and duties to the Chief Executive Officer and other employees in accordance with the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1995* (the Act).

This report recommends that the 2023/2024 annual review of the Delegation of Authority Register be adopted.

DISCLOSURE OF ANY INTEREST

Nil by author or responsible officer.

BACKGROUND

Delegations provide an appropriate level of authority to the CEO and committees to undertake effective and timely day to day statutory functions and to allow Council to focus on strategic planning, decision making and community leadership. Effective delegations promote accountability and facilitate efficient service delivery to the community.

The current Delegation of Authority Register, located on the official Shire website, used model delegations produced by the Western Australia Local Government Association (WALGA).

Council last reviewed its delegations at the Ordinary Meeting of Council held on 29 June 2023 (Resolution No. 69/23). Delegation details must be recorded in a register, which is available for inspection by the public.

STATUTORY ENVIRONMENT

The *Local Government Act 1995* regulates the ability of a local government to delegate the exercise of its powers or discharge its duties under the Act.

Local Government Act 1995 s5.16 Delegation of some powers and duties to certain committeesA local government may delegate to a committee any of its powers and duties. Delegations are to be in writing and may be general or as otherwise provided in the instrument of delegation.

Local Government Act 1995 s5.17 Limits on delegation of powers and duties to certain committees

A local government can delegate to a committee comprising council members only, any of the council's power or duties except any power or duty that requires a decision of an absolute majority or a 75% majority of the local government and any other power or duty that is prescribed.

Local Government Act 1995 s5.18 Register of delegations to committees

A local government is to keep a register of the delegations made to committees and review the delegations at least once every financial year.

Local Government Act 1995 s5.42. Delegation of some powers and duties to CEO

A local government may delegate to the CEO (absolute majority required) the exercise of any of its powers or the discharge of any of its duties under (subject to limitations). Delegations are to be in writing and may be general or as otherwise provided in the instrument of delegation.

Local Government Act 1995 s. 5.43. Limits on delegations to CEO

There are a range of activities that the Shire cannot delegate to a CEO, like; any power or duty that requires a decision of an absolute majority of the Council; appointing an auditor; or borrowing money on behalf of the Shire.

Local Government Act 1995 s. 5.44. CEO may delegate powers and duties to other employees

A CEO may delegate to any employee of the Shire, any of the CEO's delegations (other than the power of delegation).

Local Government Act s.5.45 Other matters relevant to delegations under this Division

A delegation made under this division has effect for the period of time specified in the delegation and where no period has been specified, indefinitely. Any decision to amend or revoke a delegation by a local government is to be by an absolute majority. A local government can perform any of its functions by acting through a person other than the CEO or a CEO performing any of his or her functions by acting through another person.

Local Government Act 1995 s. 5.46. Register of, and records relevant to, delegations to CEO and employees

A register of the delegations made is to be kept, as are records of the exercise of those delegations, and at least once every financial year, delegations are to be reviewed by the delegator.

Local Government Act 1995 s.9.4 Advice of objection and review rights

Any decision which has the effect of granting, renewing, varying or cancelling a permission or authorisation under the Local Government Act or a Local Law is a decision is 'quasi-judicial' and subject to objection and appeal rights (and can be referred to the State Administration Tribunal).

Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996 - Regulation 19 Delegates to keep certain records (Act s.5.46(3))

Where a power or duty has been delegated under the Act, the person whom the power or duty has been delegated is to keep a written record of how and when the power was exercised and the persons or classes of persons, other than council, committee members or employees who were directly affected by the exercise of the power.

Public Health Act 2016;

Planning and Development Act 2005;

Environment Protection Act 1986;

Main Roads Act 1930; and

Road Traffic (Vehicles) Act 2012.

A register of delegations of authority is essential in order to inform the public of the activities, functions, powers and duties of the local government as well as meeting the requirements of section 5.46 of the Act.

Local governments utilise levels of delegated authority to undertake day-to-day statutory functions, thereby allowing Council to focus on policy development, representation, strategic planning and community leadership, with the organisation focussing on the day-to-day operations of the Shire. The use of delegated authority means the large volume of routine work of a local government can be effectively managed and acted on promptly, which in turn facilitates efficient service delivery to the community.

The annual review process does not preclude the Council from granting new delegations to the CEO if and when required, nor for it to review existing delegations at any time during the course of the financial year.

The recent amendment to the *Local Government Act* has been reviewed. At this point the reforms are not expected to require any changes to the current delegations. The supporting regulations will need to be reviewed when they are released and should any changes be required these will be brought back to Council for adoption.

INTRODUCTION

Introduction

The purpose of delegations is to assist with improving the time taken to make decisions within the constraints allowed by the relevant legislation. This is consistent with the Shire's commitment to a strong customer service focus.

The Delegation Register describes the function being delegated, and details the head of power for each delegation, including legislation and Council policies, to enable cross-referencing. The Register will be reviewed on an annual basis in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1995*. The coordination of the review will be performed by the Chief Executive Officer. All Managers will provide a report to the CEO before 30 April each year with recommendations for any delegation changes. Unless deemed urgent, changes to the register will only occur at the annual review.

Where listed, some of these functions are sub-delegated by the Chief Executive Officer to Shire employees.

Apart from the *Local Government Act 1995*, regulations and the Shire of Derby West/Kimberley local laws created under the Act, a number of other pieces of legislation also provide for the delegation of authority by the Council.

Background to Delegations and Authorisations

Delegations and authorisations are the means by which decision making bodies can access the power to undertake certain statutory functions.

A delegation is the conferral of the ability to exercise a power or duty under legislation to a person or committee from a local authority that is vested with the responsibility to exercise that power or duty.

An authorisation is the designation of an officer as a person that is capable of exercising a statutory power or duty.

When a person exercises delegated authority they do so "on behalf" of the delegator and in doing so the person exercising delegated authority makes the decision "on behalf" of the delegator.

An authorised person exercises a statutory function in their own right.

The Western Australian local government statutory regime also provides for the Council and CEO to "act through" other officers to achieve statutory functions. "Acting through" in this manner is not the exercise of delegated authority or an authorised power and must be handled differently.

The Department of Local Government and Communities provides a guideline on delegation to local governments in Western Australia. (Local Government Guideline No. 17 – Delegations).

The Concept of "Acting Through"

(Extract from Local Government Guideline No. 17 – Delegations)

In addition to covering delegations, the Local Government Act 1995 introduces the concept of "acting through". Section 5.45 of the Act states that in relation to delegations, nothing prevents a "local government from performing any of its functions by acting through a person other than the CEO" or "a CEO from performing any of his or her functions by acting through another person".

The Act does not specifically define the meaning of the term "acting through". However, the key difference between a delegation and "acting through" is that a delegate exercises the delegated decision making function in his or her own right. The principle issue is that where a person has no discretion in carrying out a function, then that function may be undertaken through the "acting through" concept. Alternatively, where the decision allows for discretion on the part of the decision maker, then that function needs to be delegated for another person to have that authority."

Determining What Should be Delegated

(Extracts from Local Government Guideline No. 17 – Delegations)

A decision to delegate a power or duty should be made by local governments only after thorough consideration of whether the delegation will facilitate the effective operation of the local government. This will therefore depend on the particular circumstances of each local government.

The principal consideration for a local government when deciding if it should delegate a power or duty, is whether the delegation will improve the efficiency of the local government's operations whilst ensuring that its policies are consistently implemented.

Standard Conditions of Delegations

All delegations are subject to the following Standard Conditions:

- In exercising delegation any and all Officers or Committees to whom authority has been delegated shall comply with any and all laws and regulations in force in Western Australia; and the requirements of any and all local laws and policies of the Shire of Derby/West Kimberley.
- 2. In exercising delegation any and all Officers or Committees to whom authority has been delegated shall exercise the delegation in accordance with any budget authority where applicable.
- 3. Delegated authority cannot be exercised where a financial interest or interest affecting impartiality is evident.
- 4. It is a statutory requirement to maintain a record of each decision made under delegated authority. Documents relating to delegated authority decisions shall as a minimum, record:
 - a. Date the decision was exercised;
 - b. Name of the officer/committee exercising the decision;
 - c. Description of how the person exercised the power or discharged the duty, including where appropriate, any directions to staff to carry out work associated with the decision unless those directions are included in policies, corporate guidelines or the delegation register;
 - d. Notation of the people or class of people directly affected by the decision (other than Council or committee members or employees of the Shire).

- 5. The requirements of point 4 shall be incorporated into the Shire record system (Synergy).
- 6. A person to whom a power is delegated is considered to be a 'designated employee" under s.5.74(b) of the Local Government Act 1995 and is required to complete a Primary Return when commencing in the position and an Annual Return for each financial year thereafter.

1 BASIS OF PREPARATION AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PREPARATION

This prescribed financial report has been prepared in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1995* and accompanying regulations.

Local Government Act 1995 requirements

Section 6.4(2) of the Local Government Act 1995 read with the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996, prescribe that the financial report be prepared in accordance with the Local Government Act 1995 and, to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the Act, the Australian Accounting Standards. The Australian Accounting Standards (as they apply to local governments and not-for-profit entities) and Interpretations of the Australian Accounting Standards Board were applied where no inconsistencies exist.

The Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 specify that vested land is a right-of-use asset to be measured at cost, and is considered a zero cost concessionary lease. All right-of-use assets under zero cost concessionary leases are measured at zero cost rather than at fair value, except for vested improvements on concessionary land leases such as roads, buildings or other infrastructure which continue to be reported at fair value, as opposed to the vested land which is measured at zero cost. The measurement of vested improvements at fair value is a departure from AASB 16 which would have required the Shire to measure any vested improvements at zero cost.

Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996, regulation 34 prescribes contents of the financial report. Supporting information does not form part of the financial report.

Accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise. Except for cash flow and rate setting information, the financial report has been prepared on the accrual basis and is based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT REPORTING ENTITY

All funds through which the Shire controls resources to carry on its functions have been included in the financial statements forming part of this financial report.

All monies held in the Trust Fund are excluded from the financial statements.

Judgements and estimates

The preparation of a financial report in conformity with Australian Accounting Standards requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that effect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses.

The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors believed to be reasonable under the circumstances; the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The balances, transactions and disclosures impacted by accounting estimates are as follows:

- estimated fair value of certain financial assets
- impairment of financial assets
- estimation of fair values of land and buildings, infrastructure and investment property
- estimation uncertainties made in relation to lease accounting
- estimated of fair value of provisions






Assets for which the fair value as at the date of acquisition is under \$5,000 are not recognised as an asset in accordance with Financial Management Regulation 17A (5). These assets are expensed immediately.

Where multiple individual low value assets are purchased together as part of a larger asset or collectively forming a larger asset exceeding the threshold, the individual assets are recognised as one asset and capitalised.

Initial recognition and measurement for assets held at cost Plant and equipment including furniture and equipment is recognised at cost on acquisition in accordance with *Financial Management Regulation 17A*. Where acquired at no cost the asset is initially recognise at fair value. Assets held at cost are depreciated and assessed for impairment annually.

Initial recognition and measurement between mandatory revaluation dates for assets held at fair value. In relation to this initial measurement, cost is determined as the fair value of the assets given as consideration plus costs incidental to the acquisition. For assets acquired at zero cost or otherwise significantly less than fair value, cost is determined as fair value at the date of acquisition. The cost of non-current assets constructed by the Shire includes the cost of all materials used in construction, direct labour on the project and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overheads.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Shire has a present legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Employee Related Provisions

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the Shire's obligations for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly before 12 months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries and sick leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled.

The Shire's obligations for short-term employee benefits such as wages, salaries and sick leave are recognised as a part of current trade and other payables in the calculation of net current assets.

Other long-term employee benefits

The Shire's obligations for employees' annual leave and long service leave entitlements are recognised as employee related provisions in the statement of financial position.

Long-term employee benefits are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. Expected future payments incorporate anticipated future wage and salary levels, durations of service and employee departures and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on government bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the terms of the obligations. Any remeasurements for changes in assumptions of obligations for other long-term employee benefits are recognised in profit or loss in the periods in which the changes occur. The Shire's obligations for long-term employee benefits are presented as non-current provisions in its statement of financial position, except where the Shire does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least 12 months after the end of the reporting period, in which case the obligations are presented as current provisions.

Contract liabilities

An entity's obligation to transfer goods or services to a customer for which the entity has received consideration (or the amount is due) from the customer.

Capital grant/contribution liabilities

Grants to acquire or construct recognisable non-financial assets to identified specifications be constructed to be controlled by the Shire are recognised as a liability until such time as the Shire satisfies its obligations under the agreement.

13.1 REGIONAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA INQUIRY

SUMMARY

A Western Australian State Parliamentary Inquiry into regional telecommunications in Western Australia has recently been launched. The terms of reference for the inquiry are "to inquire into and report on issues impacting regional telecommunications in Western Australia".

Telecommunications is a critical service to everyone in Australia, yet its service reach in remote areas like our shire is limited and even where it exists, is deficient. That lower level of access lessens the community wellbeing and the economic efficiencies of our district, and the adverse impact of that is magnified due to the remoteness of the district and its numerous communities within it.

This report proposes that a submission be made to the WA Standing Committee on Public Administration, outlining the situation in our district and calling for improvements to be made.

BACKGROUND

On 20 March 2024, the WA Parliament's Legislative Assembly Standing Committee on Public Administration resolved to establish an inquiry into regional telecommunications in Western Australia. The terms of reference for the inquiry are:

The Standing Committee on Public Administration resolves to inquire into and report on issues impacting regional telecommunications in Western Australia

The closing date for submissions is 26 April 2024.

The functions of the Standing Committee on Public Administration are to:

- (a) inquire into and report on —
- (i) the structure, efficiency and effectiveness of the system of public administration;
- (ii) the extent to which the principles of procedural fairness are embodied in any practice or procedure applied in decision making;
- (iii) the existence, adequacy, or availability, of merit and judicial review of administrative acts or decisions; and
- (iv) any Bill or other matter relating to the foregoing functions referred by the Council; and

(b) consult regularly with the Parliamentary Commissioner for Administrative Investigations, the Public Sector Commissioner, the Information Commissioner, the Inspector of Custodial Services, and any similar officer.

Telecommunications is a critical world-wide service and its importance will only grow over time. There are very few aspects of life or business that do not rely in some way on having telecommunications access, yet its reach in remote areas like our shire, is limited. That less than optimal service lessens the community's wellbeing and the economic efficiencies of our district. A deficiency which is magnified due to remoteness.

There are numerous reasons why improved communications would add value to our district and its communities:

Staying Connected with Family and Friends: Telecommunications in all of its forms (land-line phones, mobile phones, internet communication options) all allow in different ways for people to keep in touch with family and friends. This is more important if contact is limited by distance/isolation, like in a remote pastoral or aboriginal community locations. The ability to make quick contact with a family member reduces anxiety, stress, and the negative perceptions that isolation can bring, and enables the maintenance of a healthy level of wellbeing for all family members.

Resolving Emergency Situations and Access to Health Services: Without telecommunications generally, and a mobile service reception in particular, you will not be able to call for help during emergencies, whether that be a personal or family medical issue, a vehicle accident or breakdown along Great Northern Highway, or as a tourist you find yourself lost on a gorge entry thoroughfare off Gibb River Road. With GPS tracking applications in most mobile phones now, emergency services can be provided with an emergency's precise location. Voice communications through home telephone, mobile, or internet means can also allow critical health and safety information to be transmitted, like how to undertake CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation). Some phones and wearable devices (e.g. watches) even have emergency alarm features to draw attention to family or emergency services when needed, so the ability for these devices to communicate through a mobile phone service can be the difference between life and death in the most serious of instances.

Maintaining Safety: Telecommunications services enhance safety and a lack of that communication capacity can have disastrous consequences. In emergencies or natural disasters, having mobile phone access in particular, can therefore be a very important lifeline. Without mobile/internet/telecommunications access, you can't receive weather alerts, call for assistance, or inform others of your situation. There is not even a consistent mobile service signal along Great Northern Highway throughout the Kimberley Region, along which thousands of people travel every day, nor is there a service available to every one of the 54 Remote Aboriginal Communities within the district of the Shire of Derby/West Kimberley. Safety is therefore compromised when telecommunications services do not exist.

Reduce the Need for Expensive Alternatives: Satellite facilitated internet services are effective but expensive for users, and reliability is impacted by the environment and satellite capabilities. Relying solely on having a mobile phone signal has obvious personal safety risks in remote areas where signal strength is weak of non-existent. This risk is particularly relevant for those travelling in unfamiliar territory. Enhanced signal strength can be secured through signal booster devices, and there are alternatives such as satellite phones and communications devices, and emergency beacons, but these are not commonly held by most people, and rarely by travellers who

infrequently visit remote areas. Enhanced mobile signals in remote areas will give the best chance for everyone to stay safe.

Eliminate Navigational Errors: Mobile phones with GPS applications provide real-time navigation. Without them, tourists can struggle to find their way in remote locations like the Kimberley. This is particularly relevant for those unfamiliar with the region. Maps and compasses have long been replaced by GPS mobile phone applications, yet mobile phone service levels have not kept pace with even this quit basic level of technology.

Essential Skills Development and Employability: We all live in a technology driven world and that includes people living and working in remote locations. Being "work-ready" in a technological environment is benefitted by an early age exposure to technology. Familiarity with modern technology through good internet access, and through that access gaining a good general knowledge of how technology can benefit employees and employers, is definitely an advantage in today's job market. Owning a mobile phone for example, and having an effective mobile service, helps young people develop their school-based educational skills and improves their future work opportunities. Poor townsite mobile service levels (like in Derby townsite) therefore detract from the ability of our youth to grow their technological understanding and skill-base.

Replace Superseded Technology: Additional to the above social issues, is the technical matter of the soon to be "obsolete" 3G coverage (which Telstra is no longer providing from 1 July 2024). Whilst most mobile phone users will not be impacted by this as they live in metropolitan areas and have contemporary standard 4/5G mobile phones, there are impacts in remote areas. It is understood that removal of the 3G coverage will not automatically be replaced with a 4G signal, resulting in an absence of any signal at all in some areas. Also, people with an older model (3G) phone will need to replace that phone in order to access a telecommunications provider mobile signal.

Economic Development: Having low speed land-line or expensive satellite internet services add costs and inconvenience to local businesses, restrict business growth, and reduce the attractiveness of new businesses to establish themselves in remote areas. A goal of providing "metropolitan grade" internet services across remote areas should prevail.

STATUTORY ENVIRONMENT

The WA Parliament's Legislative Assembly Standing Committee on Public Administration resolved to establish an inquiry into regional telecommunications in Western Australia, to inquire into and report on issues impacting regional telecommunications in Western Australia.

The functions of the Standing Committee on Public Administration are to:

- (a) inquire into and report on —
- (i) the structure, efficiency and effectiveness of the system of public administration;
- (ii) the extent to which the principles of procedural fairness are embodied in any practice or procedure applied in decision making;
- (iii) the existence, adequacy, or availability, of merit and judicial review of administrative acts or decisions; and
- (iv) any Bill or other matter relating to the foregoing functions referred by the Council; and
- (b) consult regularly with the Parliamentary Commissioner for Administrative Investigations, the Public Sector Commissioner, the Information Commissioner, the Inspector of Custodial Services, and any similar officer.

NBN has a commitment to service the nation in some form (like fibre optic or copper cable, or via satellite). There is no know legislative requirement however, that compulsorily requires providers to service remote areas with a mobile signal. The Australian Government however, has for many years funded remote mobile telecommunications improvements through its *Mobile Black Spot Program*.

COMMENT

It is not clear from the Terms of Reference of the Inquiry, when considered against the functions of the Standing Committee, what the thrust of the Inquiry might be, but none-the-less it is certainly worth longing a submission.

The concerns are obvious to everyone living in remote areas, and the solution requires positive government intervention to provide the finances or the legislation to enable an umbrella style telecommunications coverage of all areas of habituated or regularly attended areas of Western Australia.

Submission - Inquiry into issues impacting regional telecommunications in Western Australia.

Please find attached, a copy of the Shire of Derby/West Kimberley Council's position on the issues impacting regional telecommunications in Western Australia.

The concerns about sub-optimal telecommunications are obvious to everyone living in remote areas, and the solution requires positive government intervention to provide the finances or the legislation to enable an umbrella style telecommunications coverage of all areas of habituated or regularly attended areas of Western Australia, including:

- 1. Direct state government grants to all residents in the Kimberley with an existing 3G mobile phone, to enable them to purchase a 4G mobile phone;
- Direct state government grants to students and schools in remote areas to purchase contemporary standard telecommunications technology connections, boosters, and related hardware;
- Direct state government grants to aboriginal communities in remote areas to purchase contemporary standard telecommunications technology connections, boosters, and other related hardware;
- Direct state government grants to individuals to purchase mobile booster technology for their motor vehicle/house/business;
- Direct state government grants to telecommunications service providers to expand and/or enhance telecommunications service coverage and service level capacity;
- Legislation to require minimum telecommunications service standards to remotes areas, including the provision of "Metropolitan Grade" internet services, and the replacement of the superseded 3G signal technology with an equivalent 4G service area coverage; and
- 7. Lobbying of the Federal Government to secure 1-6 above where the responsibility lays with that level of government.

Telecommunications is a critical service to everyone, yet its service reach in remote areas like ours is limited, and even where it does exist, it is deficient. That lower level of access lessens the community wellbeing, safety, and the economic efficiencies of our district, and the adverse impact of that is magnified due to our remoteness. There are numerous reasons expanded upon in the attachment as to why improved communications would add value to any regional or remote district and its communities, and which in brief are:

- Staying Connected with Family and Friends;
- Resolving Emergency Situations and Access to Health Services;
- Maintaining Safety;
- Reducing the Need for Expensive Alternatives;
- Eliminate Navigational Errors; and

Facilitating Essential Skills Development and Employability.

The Committee's consideration of our submission and the WA State Parliament's follow-up action to address the deficiencies of telecommunication in the Kimberley is requested.

SUMMARY

This item is for Council to consider the reallocation of funds to maximise the benefits to council and compliance with the requirements of the various funding streams.

DISCLOSURE OF ANY INTEREST

BACKGROUND

Council adopted its 23/24 financial year budget in August 2023 with the inclusion of several capital projects throughout the Infrastructure department. Several of these projects included funds which are derived from the *Roads to Recovery* fund (R2R).

This fund is a five-year program which began on 1 July 2019 and will end on 30 June 2024. The requirements for this fund are strict in that all projects have to be entered in the online portal by the 30 April 2024. All of the said projects within this fund have to be fully expended by the 30 December 2024.

There is a risk with one particular project that the funds will not be expended by this time and there are several urgent projects which require minor reallocation of funding to better meet the present needs of the community.

The Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) fund has been allocated to undertake numerous small upgrades to the footpath network, however the funding body, prefer a succinct project hence a change to delivery for this funding stream will also be suggested.

STATUTORY ENVIRONMENT

 - (1) A local government is not to incur expenditure from its municipal fund for an additional purpose except where the expenditure
 - (a) is incurred in a financial year before the adoption of the annual budget by the local government; or

 - (c) is authorised in advance by the mayor or president in an emergency.
 - * Absolute majority required.
 - (1a) In subsection (1) —

additional purpose means a purpose for which no expenditure estimate is included in the local government's annual budget.

- (2) Where expenditure has been incurred by a local government
 - (a) pursuant to subsection (1)(a), it is to be included in the annual budget for that financial year; and
 - (b) pursuant to subsection (1)(c), it is to be reported to the next ordinary meeting of the council.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

At the present time, Council has the following funds allocated to the various projects in the 2023/24 budget (see breakdown of funding in the attached spreadsheet).

RPG – Road Project Grant, FAGs – Federal Assistance Grant scheme

Geikie Gorge and Bungardi Floodway \$305,000(R2R) \$610,000(RPG) – Total \$910,000;

Alfonsas Street \$100,000(R2R); \$350,000(FAGs); \$150,000(Council) – Total \$600,000;

Unallocated R2R funds \$94,000;

Sandford Road Lights \$75,000 (Council Funds);

Footpath Repairs in FX \$79,734 (LRCI); and

Derby Airport Road \$350,000 (LRCI).

The above listed funds are what Council allocated in the 2023/24 financial year budget and there are two issues that have arisen. One is that the R2R funds allocated to the Geikie Gorge road and Bungardi floodway must be spent by 30 of December 2024 as these funds are part of the R2R's 2019 - 2024 program. Officers cannot guarantee the spend, as Main Roads Western Australia are planning to upgrade the floodway as part of its works from the 2023 flood but no definite design has been presented to the Shire at this point in time, making it difficult to prepare the design work for the project.

The second issue is that LRCI have confirmed that the footpath work listed at just below \$80K for multiple small works is a program style not favoured by the department, preferring instead to fund succinct/specific projects.

It is therefore be recommended that the following occurs:

- 1. The Geikie Gorge road and Bungardi creek floodway upgrade be moved to the 2024/25 financial year with the R2R funds coming from the new 2024 2029 funding stream (versus the time constrained 2019 2024 funding stream);
- 2. Alfonsas Street use all R2R funds from the above project and any unallocated funds, noting that this project will be complete in the near future and therefore guaranteeing the spend of the R2R funds from the 2019 2024 funding stream;
- 3. That the remaining funds from the Alfonsas Street project (being Council and FAG's) to be reallocated to the purchase of the Sandford Road lights (\$8,000), footpath repairs in Fitzroy Crossing (\$79,734), new street lighting in Fitzroy Crossing on the Horizon power network

(\$105,367.58) and additional funds totalling \$200,000 to be allocated to the Derby Airport Road; and

4. A new LRCI project be considered to be delivered in Fitzroy Crossing, being a new footpath from the intersection of Flynn and Fallon roads to the hospital (\$100,000).

Lastly officers are looking to remove the 2 bays of the ship loader where it has become unsafe and is in a deteriorated condition – it will be proposed to expend some of the Kimberley Mineral sands funds to allow this to occur.

SUMMARY

This item is for Council to consider the installation of street lights across various locations in both Derby and Fitzroy Crossing.

DISCLOSURE OF ANY INTEREST

Nil Responsible Officer

The Director of Infrastructure has a proximity interest for additional streetlights in McDonald Way due to being a neighbouring property.

BACKGROUND

Over the last few years there have been several complaints for additional street lighting across various locations in both townsites. These complaints have increased in periods of high crime due to the offenders being able to move under the cover of darkness to commit crimes on properties located in the vicinity of these "dark spots".

The Streets receiving most complaints are as follows;

Fitzroy Crossing

- Fallon Road 4 lights
- Sadler Court 3 lights
- Poole Court 3 lights

Derby

- Villiers Street 4 lights
- Johnston Street 1 light
- Ashley Street 1 light
- Carnarvon Street 1 light
- McDonald Street 2 lights

This gives a total of 10 lights in Fitzroy Crossing and 9 lights in Derby. The complaints for Fitzroy Crossing are almost coming in on a fortnightly basis due to the issues currently being experienced.

Officers have also undertaken a full audit of the town noting areas of concern of which some are being addressed by Horizon Power such as angle of lights etc to better light the road reserves. However, these proposed lights are in areas where there are little to no street lights.

Exact locations of the street lights are provided in the attachments.

The installation of the street lights does come at a significant cost with the installation in Derby costing \$92,416.44 and Fitzroy Crossing costing \$105,367.58.

The additional lighting will also cost \$4,081.23 based on current Horizon Power rates per annum on top of the \$220,000 we already pay in street lighting annually.

There currently is no budget for these costs however it will be proposed to undertake the following;

The reallocation of some funds from Alfonsas Street from the Federal Assistance Grant portion of those funds to allow the Fitzroy Crossing lights to be installed with the Derby lights installation being programmed for the 2024/25 financial budget.

5. Commencement and Completion of Works

Horizon Power will not commence Works until the cost of the Works as set out in the Quote has been received in full by Horizon Power. Any commencement and completion dates set out in the Quote are indicative only and are not guaranteed by Horizon Power.

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You are responsible for accurately pegging all necessary boundaries to enable accurate placement of cables in the allocated alignment. You acknowledge that if the boundaries are not accurately pegged then Horizon Power may incur additional costs in performing the Works which will be treated as a modification to the Works under this Contract.

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8. Excluded costs

Costs for reinstatement or works associated with other services are not included unless specifically stated.

9. Modification of Works

Horizon Power may, acting reasonably, vary, alter, modify or amend the Works at any time. You may request Horizon Power to modify the Works but Horizon Power may only agree in its sole discretion, Any additional charges incurred by Horizon Power due to any modification to the Works (whether the modification was made by Horizon Power or made at your request) will be payable by you to Horizon Power prior to Works commencing or continuing.

10. Design fee

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If the actual costs incurred by Horizon Power in preparing the detailed design and formal quote exceed \$6,000 (including GST), the difference will be incorporated into the formal quote and will be payable by you in accordance with the terms and conditions attached to the formal quote.

The design fee must be paid before Horizon Power will commence the relevant design and revised quote and is in addition to any amounts payable under clause 9. This design fee, once paid, is not refundable.

11. Cancellation fee

If you cancel or modify the Works, an Administration fee as published in Networks Charges Schedule will be deducted from the refund cheque or added to the revised quote and payable in advance of the modification.

12. Force Majeure

Horizon Power is not liable to you for any loss, damage or expense caused by or attributable to Force Majeure. In the event of Force Majeure, Horizon Power may suspend the Works for the period until Horizon Power considers, acting reasonably, that the event of Force Majeure has passed. Horizon Power will not be liable to you in any way in respect of such suspension.

13. Consequential losses excluded

Horizon Power will not be liable for any loss of use, production, profit, revenue, contract or anticipated savings, interruption to any business, or any special, indirect or consequential loss or damage incurred by you in connection with the Works except where such losses or damages are incurred as a result of gross negligence or willful default of Horizon Power.

14. Assignment

Horizon Power may assign, novate, licence, charge or otherwise deal with any of its rights and obligations under this Contract without your prior written consent. You must not, without Horizon Power's prior written approval, assign or novate any of your rights and obligations under the Contract.

15. Resolution of disputes

If the parties are not able to resolve a dispute arising out of this Contract, each party agrees that the dispute must be submitted to arbitration in accordance with the Institute of Arbitrators and Mediators of Australia Rules for the Conduct of Commercial Arbitrations.

16. Application of Law

Nothing contained in this Contract shall in any way limit the operation or effect of the *Electricity Corporations Act 2005*, *Energy Operators (Powers) Act 1979*, or any other Law.

17. Notice

Any notice, consent, demand, approval or communication made under this Contract must be in writing, in English and hand delivered, sent by facsimile or pre-paid post, or emailed to the recipient's address.

18. Severability

Part or all of any provision of this Contract that is illegal or unenforceable may be severed from this Contract and the remaining provisions of this Contract continue in force.

19. Survival

The clauses dealing with consequential losses will survive after the Works have been commissioned.

20. Governing Law and jurisdiction







SUMMARY

The Community Grants Program Review report presented to Council at the Ordinary Council Meeting (OCM) on 28 March 2024 was deferred to allow additional information to be prepared. This report provides a draft Terms of Reference for the Community Grants Review Group (CGRG) for endorsement.

DISCLOSURE OF ANY INTEREST

Nil by Author or Responsible Officer.

BACKGROUND

The report recommending improvements to the Shire's current Community Grants Program processes was presented to Council at OCM on 28 March 2024. At this meeting, feedback was received from Elected Members to provide more information regarding the processes and guidelines for the CGRG. The item was subsequently deferred.

These guidelines have now been developed and included as a draft Terms of Reference document for review – see Attachment Two.

Councillors O'Meara and Foley expressed an interest in becoming members of this group.

STATUTORY ENVIRONMENT

Part 6 – Financial Management of the *Local Government Act 1995* applies to this report in that each year Council allocates an annual budget to donate to community organisations through the Community Funding Scheme.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

Policy F19 – Community Funding Scheme provides guidance as to the provision of financial and non-monetary assistance to community groups and non-for-profit organisations by the Shire.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The amount of money available to be distributed to community groups each year is allocated as part of Council's budgeting process. In the 2023/24 financial year \$40,000 was allocated for the Community Development Grants Program, with a further \$35,000 allocated for stipulated events

such as the Derby and Fitzroy Crossing Rodeo events, Festivals in Derby and Fitzroy Crossing and the Mowanjum Festival.

This report recommends the availability of additional funding to support individuals participating in events at a State, Federal or International representative levels.

CONSULTATION

Members of the assessment panel were consulted in the development of this report, along with other Officers who work in the Community Development Team. External consultation was not deemed to be necessary, although ad hoc feedback from applicants to the program was considered.

Elected Members provided feedback at the 28 March 2024 OCM, which has been included through the development of a Terms of Reference document – Attachment One.

COMMENT

EXCERPT FROM OCM REPORT 28 MARCH 2024

Since the last review of the Community Development Grants program, in 2022, more than half of the funding requests received have been deemed to not meet the Community Development Grant guidelines and have been referred to Council for decision. This report recommends minor procedural changes, to reduce the administrative time spent on the grants program. These recommendations will also increase opportunities for community projects, which meet criteria, to be supported by the Shire, within a more reasonable timeline.

The report also provides information on the establishment of a funding program aimed at addressing funding requests being received to support individuals attending representative level events and programs.

The Shire provides funding and in-kind support to community-based organisations through the Community Development Grants Scheme. Through the program organisations are able to access grants of up to \$5,000 (ex GST) as cash or in-kind contributions towards the cost of undertaking projects, activities and events which enhance the community participation and wellbeing and wide community benefit. Additionally, they must align with community priorities as identified in the Shires Strategic Community Plan.

Grant money is available across a wide range of projects and services to ensure diversity of activities within the Shire. Projects may fall into areas such as arts and culture, education, sport and recreation, youth, seniors, health and welfare, tourism and non-for-profit business development. The funded projects must be accessible, equitable and affordable to community members and must take place within the Shire of Derby/ West Kimberley. Projects held outside the Shire may be considered if the applicant can suitably demonstrate the involvement of Shire residents or if it promotes the Shire on a regional basis.

Funding requests are considered as part of a quarterly competitive process and one-off funding contributions of \$5,000 (ex GST) will be considered for each project. A total of \$40,000 is available across the four funding rounds.

The Shire also provides funding for some significant, annual community events. These events are determined at the time of budget adoption.

During this financial year the Shire has received a number of requests to support individuals or groups attending activities in a representative capacity. Under the current Community Development Grant Guidelines these activities are ineligible for funding as;

- Individuals are ineligible for funding.
- Activities must take place within the Shire's boundaries unless it can be evidenced that it will have significant benefit to the community.

Such requests are currently being referred to Council on a case-by-case basis. In considering one of these requests at the 30 November Ordinary Council Meeting the Council endorsed the following recommendation;

That Council;

 - (b) Suitable promotional recognition of the Shire's contribution; and
- Request Officers investigate and establish guidelines to govern the donation of financial support for individual community members at representative events and provide a report to Council outlining the recommendations.

The last review of the Shire's Community Development Grants program was undertaken in September 2022. As a result of this review the Shire's Quick Grants Program and Community Development Grants were consolidated into one program and clarifications were made around what the funding can be used for.

Since the review 20 requests for funding have been received (not including funding requests being considered at this meeting). Of these nine have been processed as applications to the Community Development Grants. Six have been successful for receiving full or partial funding. Three have been declined as the projects did not meet funding timelines (i.e. the project has either commenced or will commence within eight weeks of the closing date of the funding round).

The remaining 11 requests have been referred to Council for decision as they did not meet the grants guidelines. The most common reason they did not meet the guidelines are not meeting funding timelines (seven requests), the business structure of the organisation requesting funding (three requests), nature of project being funded not being in line with the grant guidelines (three requests) and amount of funding being requested is in excess of \$5,000, the maximum amount granted under the program (three requests).

As outlined the most common reasons for grant applications being unsuccessful is that the project is due to the project timelines. Under the Shire's grants guidelines, it is stipulated that projects cannot commence within eight weeks of the closing of the funding round. This is to allow time for the applications to be reviewed assessed by the assessment panel, further clarification sought from applicants if required, then referred to Council for endorsement. Due to Council meeting deadlines this usually means it is unlikely that it will get to the Council meeting immediately after the closure of the round.

Currently funding applications are assessed on a quarterly basis, with funding rounds closing on the last day of March, June, September and December. Previously the Community Development Grants were assessed once per year as part of the annual budgeting process. Whilst this change

has allowed greater opportunity for projects to be funded it still does not provide the flexibility desired by the community in delivering their projects and activities.

In order to address the issues of timeliness for application assessment and notification of outcomes are provided consideration could be given to;

- Increasing the frequency of which applications are assessed. If applications were assessed
 on a monthly or bi-monthly basis funding it is likely the more funding requests could be
 addressed through the Community Development Grants Scheme and less needing to be
 referred to Council as a stand-alone item on the Council Meeting Agenda. This will save
 time for both Councillors and Officers, whilst also improving the timeliness for applicants.
- 2. Where there is insufficient time for the funding request to be referred to Council allowance could be made for the CEO in consultation with the Shire President to endorse the Officer recommendation. This will still allow for Council involvement and oversight of how the funding is distributed, but will also increase the likelihood of an application being successful by reducing the amount of time required to process and assess applications.

Whilst these changes will not alleviate the need for Council to consider some funding requests this is expected to reduce the number that don't meet guidelines and are therefore required to be considered by Council. Funding requests which fall outside the nature of the grant guidelines will continue to be referred to Council.

Additionally, there has recently been an increase in the number of funding requests which seek to obtain support to attend representative events. Examples of this include, Derby District High School's participation in YOH Fest, Derby Speedway Club's support of Jake Hoath at the National Speedway Championships in Victoria and Krui3ers participation at the In the Pine's Festival. At the November Council meeting Council endorsed a recommendation for guidelines to be developed to guide the donation of funds to individuals at these types of events, as payments for individuals are currently not allowable under the Community Funding Program.

A desktop review showed a mixed approach by other local governments in addressing these types of requests. Those who will provide financial assistance offer small donations programs which allocated funding based on the location of the activity or the level of representation. Funding is generally available for sports, arts, culture, community or training activities.

Donations generally range between \$150 to \$500 per individual. The Town of Port Hedland provides a more generous program which starts at \$500 per individual for regional representation to \$2,000 for representation requiring international travel. Unlike the other funding programs identified they also provide group-based funding ranging between \$2,000 and \$5,000. None of the other Kimberley Shire's appear to offer a program for individuals. A summary of the funding provided as attachment one.

Should the Shire decide to implement a similar program budget will need to be allocated for the program.

2. OBJECTIVES

Assisting the Shire of Derby/West Kimberley (Shire) to distribute Community Grant Funding through the Shire's Community Grants program with due care and diligence in line with:

- 1. Policy F19 Community Funding Scheme
- 2. The Community Grants guidelines (Grants » Shire of Derby / West Kimberley (sdwk.wa.gov.au))
- 3. Code of Conduct for Shire Councillors.
- 4. Shire's Values and Vision.
- 5. Shire's Strategic Community Plan.
- 6. The Shire's annual community grants budget.
- 7. Recommendations from Community Development team employees.

3. RESPONSIBILITIES AND SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES

- 3.1 CGRG is responsible for reviewing all applications received via the Shire Community Grants program.
- 3.2 Making decisions on whether funding applications are approved, or rejected, in line with Community Grant guidelines, and recommendations from the Community Development team.
- 3.3 Providing guidance to Community Development team on communication to applicants. 3.4 Providing guidance to Community Development team regarding reports to Council on Community Grants.

4. CGRG MEMBERSHIP

- 4.1 The CGRG is a group with representation from the Shire's Council, with membership appointed annually by the Council any changes in membership require the Council's formal approval. Invited guests, including Shire employees have no decision-making voting powers. 4.2 Council Membership-three (3) Council members (including the Shire President).
- 4.3 The Chair is to be appointed at the first Group meeting following each Annual General Meeting and will be selected by the Group.
- 4.4 The Executive Director of Operations and Strategic Development, Manager of Community Development, and Community Development Team Leader, are Ex Officio and have no voting rights. Each of these employees may request another employee, with relevant skills and experience attend on their behalf. Either one, two or all three must be present at each meeting. However, the Group reserves the right to invite other ex officio/non-voting members, as is appropriate.

- 4.5 One of the employee representatives will be responsible for capturing minutes and providing communications and reporting to applicants, Council, and other stakeholders, as required.
- 4.6 From time-to-time individuals with specific skills may be invited to attend a meeting for a special purpose, but such an individual will have no voting rights.
- 4.7 Other Elected Members have the right to attend, as an ex-officio guest, at any time, upon their request.

5. VOTING AND QUORUM

- 5.1 Quorum is two of the three Council Members / Group members.
- 5.2 If a Quorum cannot be met due to unavailability or conflicts of interest, the applications will be reviewed by Council at the next Ordinary Council Meeting.
- 5.3 Voting will be via majority vote (two out of three voting members), and no one Group Member has additional voting power.
- 5.4 Voting must be done in line with Community Grant guidelines.

6. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

- 6.1 Voting and non-voting members must declare any conflicts of interest with applications and step out of discussion and voting for this application.
- 6.2 In the case of any Group members having a conflict, the remaining two Group members will review applications.
- 6.3 In the case of two or more Group members having a conflict with any application, the application will be reported to Council for voting at the next Ordinary Council Meeting.

7. MEETINGS

- 7.1 The subcommittee will meet at least six (6) times per calendar year, unless there are no applications to review received during the month.
- 7.2 Meetings will be held the first week of each month unless there are no applications received the month prior.
- 7.3 Meetings may be held virtually or in person.
- 7.4 Meetings will be structured with the use of an agenda and supporting documents. Regular agenda items could include:
 - Quorum present
 - Conflict of interest
 - Terms of Reference (first meeting)
 - Applications received and summary reports with recommendations presented by Community Development team.
 - New Business
 - Any other business/information
 - Close/confirmation of next meeting.

16.2 YOUTH ENGAGEMENT AND SAFETY AT DERBY YOUTH CENTRE

SUMMARY

This recommendation paper has been developed to outline the benefits, financial implications, and risk management approaches for increasing youth engagement and safety at the Derby Youth Centre.

This paper outlines and compares the costs, and benefits of the various options considered, including the key recommendation for installing a fence, with the option of art murals, at the Derby Youth Centre.

DISCLOSURE OF ANY INTEREST

Nil by Author or Responsible Officer.

BACKGROUND

Context and Background

The current Derby Youth Service Centre owned by the Shire of Derby West/Kimberley (SDWK) including the land located between Loch Street, Hardman Street and Clarendon Street in Derby is considered unsafe for youth services participants and employees, due to uncontrolled public access. This increasing risk is evidenced by the number of incident reports received, and complaints made by employees working from the centre.

There are youth services operated from this centre five days per week, and SDWK employees work from this site five to six days per week.

On average, there are around 50 to 100 children and/or young people at this site at any one time 5 days per week and 316 different children and/or young people have frequented the facility on a casual basis multiple times this year alone.

The Youth Services team has submitted 16 formal incident reports over the past 60 days.)

The following actions have been taken as short-term risk management, whilst the option of installing a new fence has been considered:

- Security Guard on site from 5th March 2024 to current date and prior to that in 2023 for a period of 4 months.
- Additional SDWK youth services employees onsite.
- Rangers including this area in their patrols deemed unviable due to other priorities and limited powers.

Unfortunately, none of the above solutions have addressed the issue, and all cost a significant amount - see further details in Financial Implications.

The only strategy attempted, which has had some success, is reengaging with WA Police. The new management team overseeing Youth services have raised concerns with WA Police, and they have responded positively, providing more presence around the centre when officers are available on an ad hoc basis.

This recommendation also encourages youth to engage in a series of art projects, to encourage them to take pride in the facility, through playing an important role in beautifying the Derby Youth Centre.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are financial implications in addressing this issue, outlined below are the key costs involved in the various solutions considered.

Current Solution

Current solutions cost SDWK approximately \$170,000 per year.

Security Officer - Currently the cost for one contract security officer employed at Youth Centre on a part-time/casual basis for 19 hours per week is \$1672, a total of \$86,944 per year at the current hourly rate.

Increased shire staffing - The increase in staffing required at the centre due to safety reasons is on average \$1600 per week, a total of \$85,800 per year.

Recommended Solution

Recommended solution includes two parts;

- 1. Secure fence installation
 - This will cost SDWK approximately \$115,000, as a once off capital expense.
- 2. Art installations

These will cost approximately \$5,000-\$8,000 each (currently awaiting quote from local youth artist). The recommendation is to complete four art murals, as a series, to be completed over 12 months, totalling \$20,000 - 32,000 for the art murals.

The recommended solutions (1&2) will total \$135,000-147,000 (pending art mural costs). This investment in the Derby Youth Centre is expected to show financial return on investment within 12 months of installation, due to the reduction in need for security guard shifts, and additional Youth Officer hours.

Potential Sources of Funding

Grant funding of \$40,000, and \$10,000 has been included for 'facility upgrades' in two (2) recent grant applications for youth services. The total grant amount requested is \$510,000 over two years, with \$50,000 (25,000 per year x two) towards facility upgrades and safety. If these grants are successful, this \$50,000 could offset the total amount of up to \$148,000 for the fencing and art installations.

The outcome of the funding application is expected in June 2024.

Future funding applications can also include contributions, towards the fence and art installations, wherever possible, to offset the Shire's contribution.

1. Executive Summary

This business case has been developed to outline the benefits, financial implications, and risk management approaches for increasing safety and youth engagement, at the Derby Youth Centre.

This paper outlines and compares the costs and benefits of the various options considered, including the key recommendation for installing a fence, and art installations, at the Derby Youth Centre.

2. Context and Background

The current Derby Youth Service Centre owned by the Shire of Derby West/Kimberley (SDWK) including the land located between Loch Street, Hardman Street and Clarendon Street in Derby is considered unsafe for youth services participants and employees, due to uncontrolled public access. This increasing risk is evidenced by the number of incident reports received, and complaints made by employees working from the centre.

There are youth services operated from this centre five days per week, and SDWK employees work from this site five to six days per week.

On average, there are around 50 to 100 children and/or young people at this site at any one time 5 days per week and 316 different children and/or young people have frequented the facility on a casual basis multiple times this year alone.

The Youth Services team has submitted 16 formal incident reports over the past 60 days.

The following actions have been taken as short-term risk management, whilst the option of installing a new fence has been considered:

Security Guard on site from 5th March 2024 to current date and prior to that in 2023 for a period of 4 months.

Additional SDWK youth services employees onsite.

Rangers including this area in their patrols – deemed unviable due to other priorities and limited powers.

Unfortunately, none of the above solutions have addressed the issue, and all cost a significant amount - see further details in Financial Implications.

The only strategy attempted, which has had some success, is reengaging with WA Police. The new management team overseeing Youth services have raised concerns with WA Police, and they have responded positively, providing more presence around the centre when officers are available on an ad hoc basis.

3. Financial Implications

There are financial implications in addressing this issue, outlined below are the key costs involved in the various solutions considered.

1. Current Solution

Current solutions cost SDWK approximately \$170,000 per year.

<u>Security Officer</u> - Currently the cost for one contract security officer employed at Youth Centre on a part-time/casual basis for 19 hours per week is \$1672, a total of \$86,944 per year at the current hourly rate.

<u>Increased shire staffing</u> - The increase in staffing required at the centre due to safety reasons is on average \$1600 per week, a total of \$85,800 per year.

2. Recommended Solution

Recommended solution (fence installation) will cost SDWK approximately \$120,000 (inc. GST), as a once off capital expense.

The recommended solution is expected to show financial return on investment within nine (9) months of installation.

Sources of Funding

Grant funding of \$40,000 has been included in a recent grant application for youth services. The total grant amount requested is \$360,000 over two years, with \$20,000 per year towards venue safety. If successful, this \$40,000 will offset the total amount of \$100,000, for the fencing.

Outcome of funding application is expected in June 2024.

Further contributions towards this fence will be included in funding applications, wherever possible, to offset the Shire's contribution.

4. Risk Assessments

4.1. Cost Risk - Rating Low

Installing a Fence is considered the lowest risk / cost option, compared to other options.

- Once installed, very limited maintenance costs will be required for the upkeep of the fence.
- The style and strength of the fence construction proposed is deemed to be suitable for the Kimberley weather patterns. The construction method of the fence would be considered tamper proof and limited damage could occur from vandalism.
- If there is significant damage to the fence, such as a vehicle driving into the fence, insurance will
 cover most of the repair costs.

4.2. Funding Risk – Rating Low

There is a risk of SDWK losing Youth Service funding if safety issues are not addressed promptly.

The programs SDWK are funded to deliver, are affected by the distraction, and deterrent of having drunk, disorderly and dangerous people wandering through the site.

4.3. Contract Obligation Risk - Rating Low

There has been one quote received from a Kimberley based fence builder. Further quotes will be sought, in line with the SDWK Procurement Policy, if this proposal receives Council Support.

4.4. Reputational Risk - Rating Low

Risk of fence being built poorly, looking intrusive. This can be mitigated with project management and oversight from Youth Services and Community Management team.

The fence is intended to also be used for promotional banners. The quality of these banners would need to comply with the shires style guide.

4.5. Work, Health, Safety - Rating Low

Continuing to ignore the reports submitted, and complaints from our Youth Services team could lead to WHS/WorkSafe claims, if any employee injuries or illness occur.

4.6 Other Risks if applicable – Rating

With the foot traffic through the facility occurring on a regular basis, the children and youth are exposed to direct and indirect dangers.

- Physical contact from people not permitted to attend or be on the Youth Centre grounds.
- Physical harm from broken bottles/glass from discarded litter. Psychological harm from being
 exposed to drunken and verbally abusive people, and/or domestic violence within the grounds. A
 risk of assault, abuse and harm from people walking through the unsecured area.

5. Community Engagement / Consultation Process

Consultation has occurred with the following stakeholders and community members.

- 1. Youth Services employees
- 2. Youth participating in the Youth Programs
- 3. WA Police Derby based.

6. Project / Proposal Specifics

Install a perimeter fence around the Derby Youth Centre grounds. Remove the old, dilapidated cyclone ring lock mesh fence that is around part of the facility.

Security officer will no longer be required. The additional Youth Team staff roster can revert to normal level.

7. Action Plan inc. Timelines

April 2024 - Approval be granted at the April Council meeting.

May 2024 – Obtain three confirmed quotes from suppliers and installer.

June 2024 – Assess the three quotes and select the preferred supplier.

July 2024 - Appoint the preferred supplier.

August 2024 - Old fence is removed, and the new fence is installed.

September 2024 - Payment to supplier be made after a full inspection of satisfaction is carried out.

8. Proposed Resolution for Approval

Options.

Option 1 – Remain the same, reject the request for fencing, leave the staffing levels and security officer roster in place, continued to be appointed indefinitely. This option has the biggest cost implications for the shire with ongoing additional staffing costs and security officer costs, approximately \$170,000 per year additional.

Option 2 - Remove the Security Officer and additional Youth Team staffing and no new fence is installed. This option is the most dangerous and considered to be too high a risk to the Youth and employees at the Centre. This option would put the Shire and staff members at risk of legal action should an issue take place and the risk of losing State Government funding currently in place for not managing risks as expected.

Option 3 - Preferred option – Approve and Install the requested fencing, remove the security officer and reduce the staffing level back to normal. The initial cost for the fence will be recovered by reducing costs by removing the security officer and additional staff. In basic terms, the fence will be recovered in the cost saving within nine (9) months at worst.


Map of the Derby Youth Centre area
