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Notes for Elected Members

NATURE OF COUNCIL'S ROLE IN DECISION MAKING

- (a) a proposed change to a planning scheme affecting land that adjoins the person's land; or
- (b) a proposed change to the zoning or use of land that adjoins the person's land; or
- (c) a proposed development (as defined in section 5.63(5)) of land that adjoins the person's land."

Regulation 34C (Impartiality) states;

"interest means an interest that could, or could reasonably be perceived to, adversely affect the impartiality of the person having the interest and includes an interest arising from kinship, friendship or membership of an association."

12.1.1 REQUEST FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR COMMERCIAL CROSSOVER

SUMMARY:

BP Colac have made application to the Shire for financial assistance to asphalt crossovers to their property at 138 Loch Street, Derby.

BACKGROUND:

A written request was made to the Chief Executive Officer in a letter dated 12 January 2016, for financial assistance to resurface the asphalt at the front of the premises of BP Colac encompassing the area where the gazetted road meets the property. This request was for an area up to 1,000 m² but did not specify the value of the contribution or support being sought.

A review of Shire Crossover Policy W1 revealed the Chief Executive Officer does not have Delegated Authority to authorise work under this policy and the matter is referred to Council for a decision.

STATUTORY ENVIRONMENT:

Local Government Act (1995)

Main Roads WA Guide to Road Design for Driveways

POLICY IMPLICATIONS:

W1 – Crossover Policy. This policy provides crossover standards for Rural and Residential properties. There is also a provision for a Council contribution towards construction costs to be calculated at 50% of either gravel or concrete standard, any standard above concrete (i.e. brick paving) to be paid at the rate of a concrete driveway.

The SDWK crossover subsidy application form states that residential owners can apply for a subsidy for up to half of the cost of a standard crossover (1st for property) to a maximum of \$1,800.

The Crossover Policy is silent on commercial premises and also on repairs subsequent to the initial installation.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

Estimates provided by the applicant based on a quoted area of 1,000 m² @ \$57.35 total \$57,350. The amount sought from Council has not been specified.

CONSULTATION:

Council's Engineering Department have inspected the site, provided estimates on construction costs in accordance with industry practice and a history of crossover applications in the Derby townsite. Council's Shire Planner has also been consulted, providing background on commercial developments and private works.

COMMENT:

The crossover area that is the subject of this request is shown in Figure 1 below.





Figure 1: Crossover areas subject to request for financial assistance.

Loch Street is a Main Roads controlled road whereby the Shire is responsible for the management of infrastructure outside the pavement to property boundaries in accordance with a long standing Memorandum of Understanding.

Council's Crossover Policy provides for residential crossovers, however is silent on those to commercial premises. Council has not previously subsidised any commercial development, rather requiring proponents to meet the cost of carparks installed within road reserves and existing developments to rectify carparks/crossovers/kerbing where they are in poor condition.

Both Council Development Approval conditions and Main Roads Driveway Policy require the property owner to be responsible for the cost to design and construct the driveways and associated works and to maintain the driveways.

The crossover policy is also silent on the maintenance of crossovers to commercial premises. We note that the Shire has already set a precedent by writing to other commercial operators requiring maintenance.

The Shire is supporting this project indirectly by grouping its own asphalt projects to help reduce mobilisation costs to others who tap onto the Derby run. The Shire will also review the drainage from the cross over to help with runoff.

Officers view there is limited ability to contribute further in the form of cash contribution based on previous policy and precedent, however Council may also wish to consider this request differently and use it as the basis for a policy review with respect to commercial premises.

SUMMARY:

This item proposes the re allocation of Roads to Recovery and Federal Assistance Grant funds to a list of new projects.

BACKGROUND:

Council adopted its 2015/16 Budget at the Ordinary Meeting on the 27th August 2015 **MINUTE NO. 87/2015.** Within this budget it listed a number of roads to be upgraded and to have capital expenditure carried out on them and the sources of funds from which the capital expenditure was being obtained (see Attachment 1 - page from 2015/16 Budget).

A number of these projects have now been completed namely being the work in Fitzroy Crossing around Sandford Rd, Millard Rd, McDonald Wy, Emanuel Wy and Loch St in Derby with the work budgeted at \$993,200 but with work being completed the actuals came in at \$231,648 on these particular roads. Some of the surplus funds (\$291,552) from the original budgeted amounts have been used on other existing road projects to increase the scope of work which means that there is a remaining balance of nearly \$470,000 of available funds to be reallocated.

The reasons why there was such an under expenditure from the budgeted amounts is assumed to be attributed to the financial down turn in the economy, lower oil

prices and the more competitive nature of the industry. The figures for the 2015/16 budget were based upon rates for works undertaken in the 2014/15 budget year.

6.8. Expenditure from municipal fund not included in annual budget

- (1) A local government is not to incur expenditure from its municipal fund for an additional purpose except where the expenditure
 - (a) is incurred in a financial year before the adoption of the annual budget by the local government; or
 - (b) is authorised in advance by resolution*; or
 - (c) is authorised in advance by the mayor or president in an emergency.

* Absolute majority required.

(1a) In subsection (1) —

additional purpose means a purpose for which no expenditure estimate is included in the local government's annual budget.

- (2) Where expenditure has been incurred by a local government
 - (a) pursuant to subsection (1)(a), it is to be included in the annual budget for that financial year; and
 - (b) pursuant to subsection (1)(c), it is to be reported to the next ordinary meeting of the council.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS:

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

There is no direct cost to Council as it is a re-allocation of Grant funds from two sources being the Roads to Recovery fund and the Federal Assistance Grants (Roads portion).

These funds are only to be spent on roads or capital projects relating to roadways and therefore cannot be used for any other purpose and need to be spent in the financial year of 2015/16 or the funds are lost.

As the funding needs to be spent within the 2015/16 financial year a list of further projects has been attached (Attachment 2) for further consideration to ensure the funds from Roads to Recovery and the roads portion of the Financial Assistance Grant are spent.

Projects number 1 through 7 are currently being priced as part of tenders that are out for consideration and it is considered that the estimates as per the attached Additional projects sheet are still conservative and therefore to offset any further savings projects 8 through 18 have been added as the next in priority should funding become available. Projects 8 through to 18 will only commence if residual funds are available from projects 1-7 or any other budgeted works and will be managed to maximise expenditure of grant funds without any further cost to Council.

SUMMARY:

The purpose of this report is for the Council to authorise the Common Seal of the Shire to be affixed on the application for Strata plan for Lot 1294 Woollybutt Corner, Derby.

BACKGROUND:

As part of Councils Housing strategy and with funds from the Country Local Government Fund a second house was constructed on lot 1294 Woollybutt Corner, Derby. As part of the contract that was let to H&M Tracey all works were carried out to ensure that the new building could be strata titled to from a new lot and give the council the ability to sell either of the properties in the future.

STATUTORY ENVIRONMENT:

9.49A. Execution of documents:

(1) A document is duly executed by a local government if —

(a) the common seal of the local government is affixed to it in accordance with subsections (2) and (3); or

(b) it is signed on behalf of the local government by a person or persons authorised under subsection (4) to do so.

(2) The common seal of a local government is not to be affixed to any document except as authorised by the local government.

(3) The common seal of the local government is to be affixed to a document in the presence of —

(a) the mayor or president; and

(b) the chief executive officer or a senior employee authorised by the chief executive officer, each of whom is to sign the document to attest that the common seal was so affixed.

(4) A local government may, by resolution, authorise the chief executive officer, another employee or an agent of the local government to sign documents on behalf of the local government, either generally or subject to conditions or restrictions specified in the authorisation.

(5) A document executed by a person under an authority under subsection (4) is not to be regarded as a deed unless the person executes it as a deed and is permitted to do so by the authorisation.

(6) A document purporting to be executed in accordance with this section is to be presumed to be duly executed unless the contrary is shown.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS:

The Shire has an existing policy concerning the Common Seal but the Act was subsequently amended as above and points (1) and (2) in particular, require that authorisation by the Council.
