This rig was on its way to refuel the Kimberley so the Shire of Derby West Kimberley Road Safety Working Group driver reviver station was a great place to refuel the trucker, Darren.

About 20 vehicles were served during the midweek Driver Reviver Station set up at Nillibubbica.

The Driver Reviver Program is a community initiative operated nationally by volunteers. The Program aims to reduce fatigue related crashes by encouraging travellers to take regular breaks in their journey by visiting an operating site for a free cup of coffee or tea, a biscuit and most importantly, a chance to stop and revive so drivers reach their destination safely.

Driver Reviver is coordinated in WA by West Australian Local Government Association's RoadWise, and is sponsored by the Toll Group (partner), the Arnott's Foundation, Bushells Coffee, Bushells Tea and Sunshine Sugar.

The SDWK Road Safety Working Group meets quarterly and co-ordinates road safety activity within the Shire. The group is currently made up of Shire elected member and officers, WA Police, Main Roads WA, community volunteers and supported by the WALGA's RoadWise Program.
