EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY



CATTLE RACE WALKWAY RESURFACING

The Shire utilised the asphalt plant being here for the airport redevelopment to resurface the walkway to the port in Derby, funded by a development grant. This will also include extra shade, interpretive heritage signage, and footpath extension from the end of the walkway to the jetty.
